International Book of Records- She achieved recognition for being the fastest pre-schooler to solve 10 sets of 9-piece jigsaw puzzles and completed the challenge in just 5 minutes, 13 seconds and 40 milliseconds. Her achievements highlight her wonderful cognitive, visual and problem-solving skills.

Diving Into Excellence: CISCE Zonal Swimming Championship 2026



Swargarani School & PU College had the honour of hosting the CISCE Zonal Swimming Championship – 2026 (Karnataka & Goa, Zone E) on 27th July 2026 at the Vijayanagar Aquatic Centre.

Building on the resounding success of the Zonal Level Skating Competition hosted last year, which earned appreciation and praise from principals, teachers, parents, and coaches for its flawless organization, the KISA [Karnataka ICSE Schools Association] requested to host the Zone E Swimming Competition this year.

It was a race to the deadline as we had just a week to organise an event of this magnitude. Nevertheless, the spirit of the Ranian teamwork came to fore and working round the clock; we were able to conduct it smoothly.

The championship was conducted under the expert guidance of Mr. Ratheesh Raveendran, National Swimming Coordinator, All India ICSE & ISC Schools and Karnataka & Goa State Committee Member. A swimmer par excellence, he has represented the Indian swimming team for World Masters Swimming Championship in Montreal, Canada 2014 and at Richonne, Italy 2012. He is also a certified international swimming coach from ASCA (American swimming coaches association).



Mr. Sanjo, Head Coach, Vijaynagar Aquatic Centre was also one of the guides and coordinator and was instrumental in our endeavour to organize this event. A committed team of 11 officials ensured that the championship was conducted in a smooth and fair manner with professionalism, discipline, and true sportsmanship.



The event witnessed enthusiastic participation from 200 talented young swimmers representing around 100 schools from South Zone. Swimmers competed in over 106 events such as Freestyle, Butterfly, Breaststroke, Backstroke, and Relay categories in 50, 100, 200, 400, 800 and 1500 metres in Individual and Medley streams. The championship was a remarkable display of skill, endurance, discipline, and sportsmanship. The winners were awarded with certificates and medals.

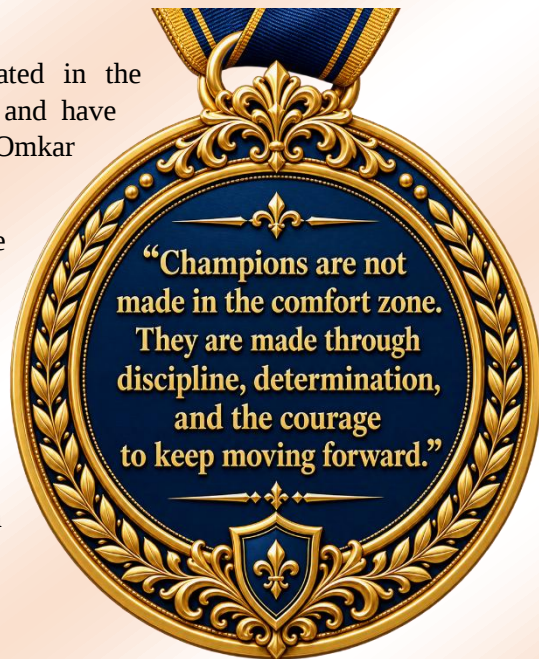
The icing on the cake was the weather. We were truly blessed by God's grace, the weather was pleasant and favourable — not hot, and perfectly suited for the competition.

YuviPep Exhibition 2026: Turning Ideas into Real-World Solutions

On 8 August 2026, Swargarani School & PU College came alive with creativity, technology and innovation during the Yuvi Pep Exhibition 2026. The exhibition provided students with a platform to showcase the knowledge and skills they had developed through hands-on learning and demonstrate how technology can be used to solve real-world problems. Students presented **ideas with a purpose**. They identified challenges from everyday life, explored possible solutions, designed prototypes and explained the technology behind their projects.



The exhibition was organised into several zones: The **Game Zone** brought together creativity, logical thinking and interactive experiences. The **3D Technology Zone** demonstrated how digital designs can be transformed into physical objects using modern design and prototyping techniques. The **Classroom Learning Zone** showcased how concepts explored during regular Yuvi Pep sessions had progressed into practical models and applications. The **Drone Zone** demonstrated how drones can be explored for different real-life applications.



They presented an array of projects - a smart watch that detects when a person is sleepwalking and sends an alert, a sustainable

energy model of wind energy being converted into electricity to power streetlights, a fire-detection robot that

identifies fire and sprays water to the affected area, a laser-based counting system that automatically counts objects or people when a beam is interrupted, several AI-based innovations such as waste segregation and posture correction systems and a concept of an earthquake-protective bed designed to keep people safe. These projects reflected a complete learning journey of observation, design, building, testing and improvement, also helping

students strengthen their communication, teamwork and presentation skills as they confidently explained and demonstrated their ideas to visitors.
